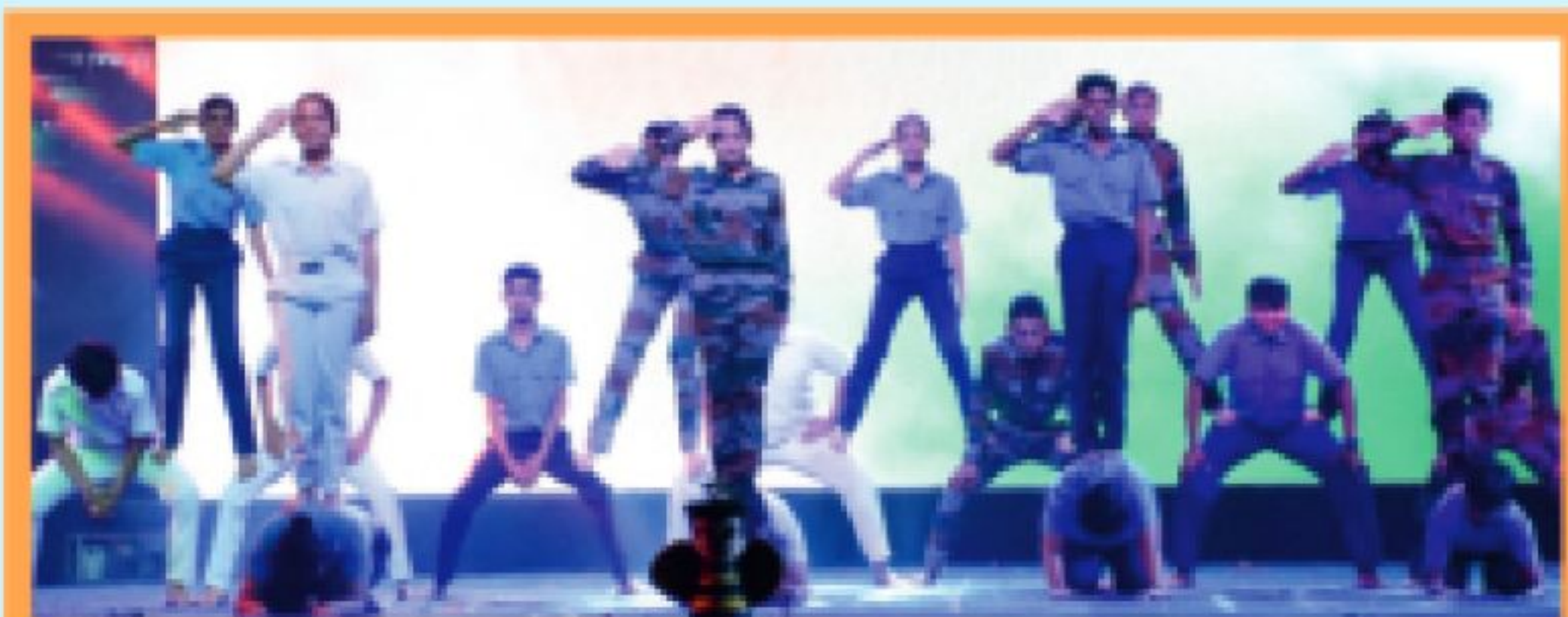

Saint Paul's School, Rajkot, marked its Silver Jubilee Celebrations with a spectacular two-day extravaganza on 14th and 15th December, 2024

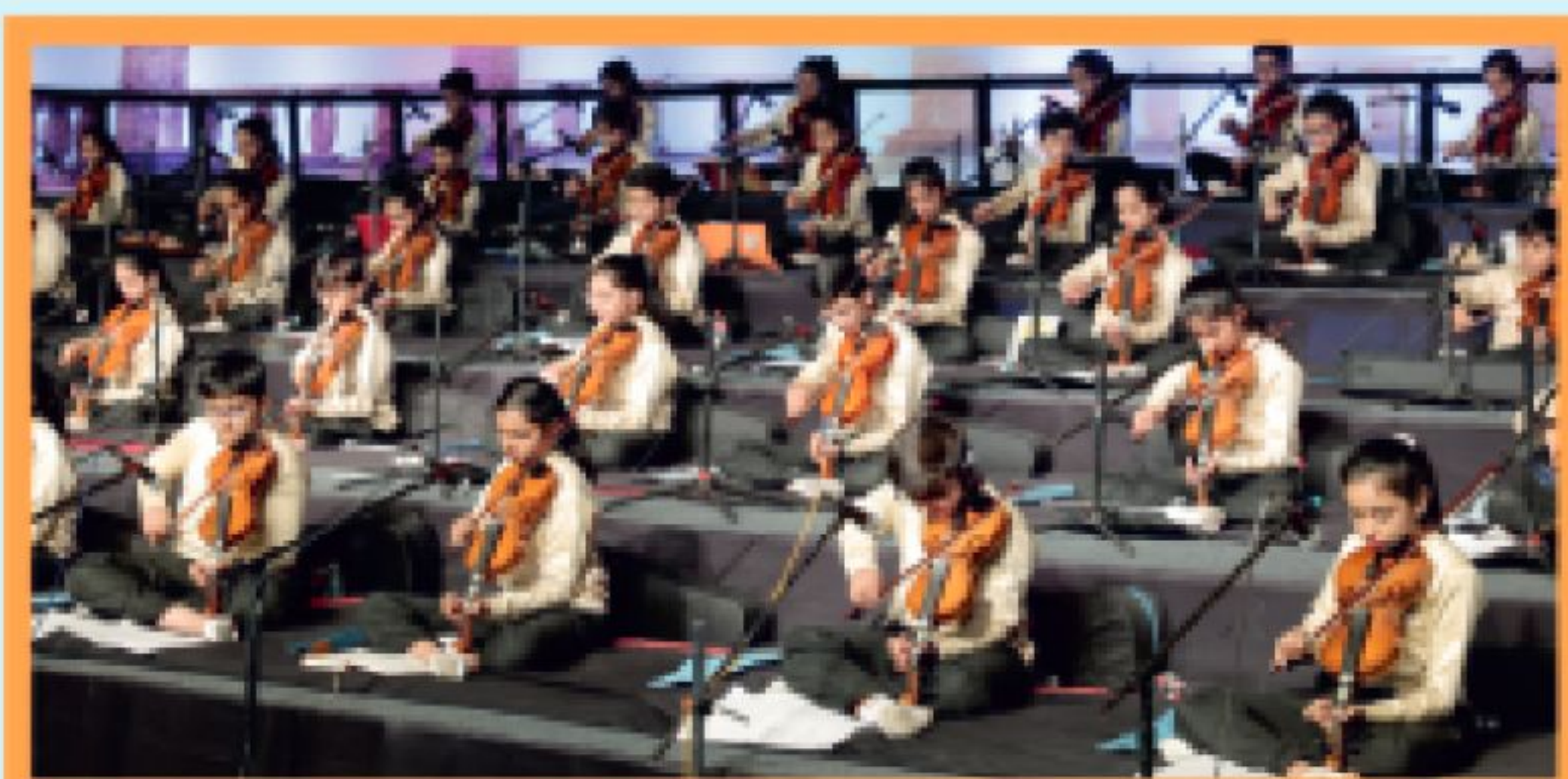
Day 1: A Journey into the Magical Realm

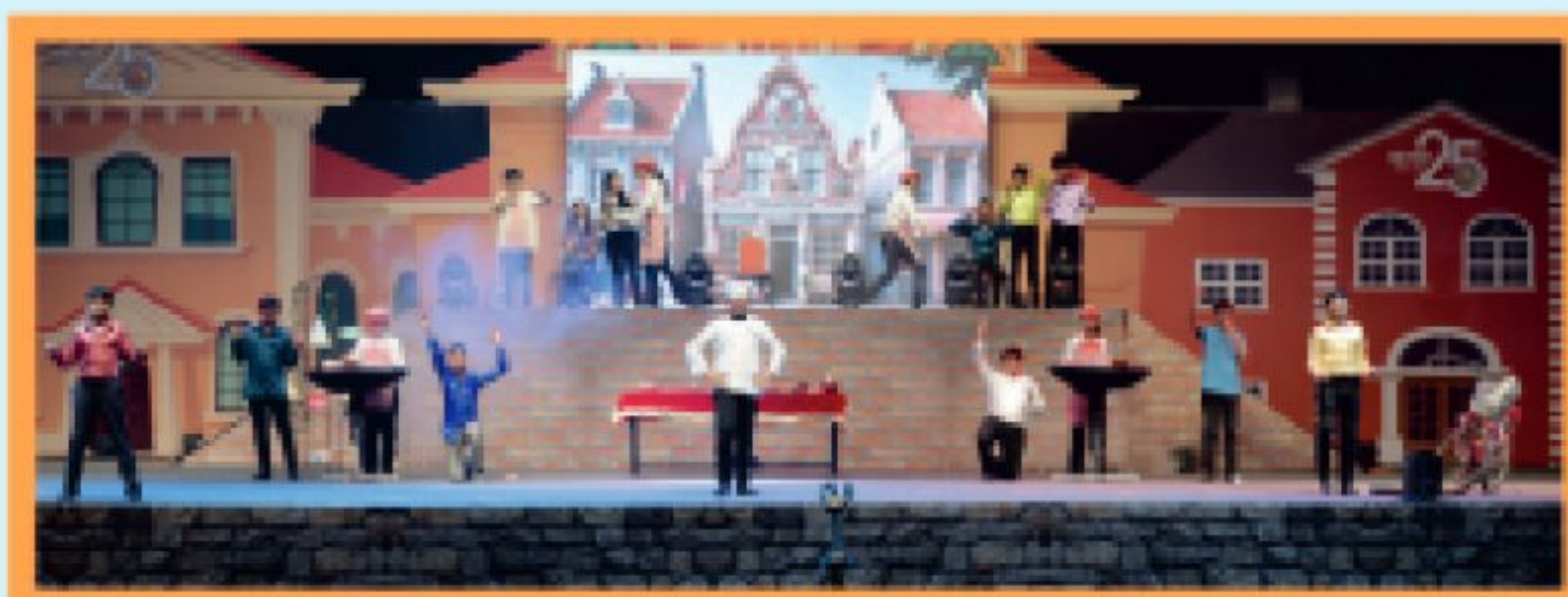

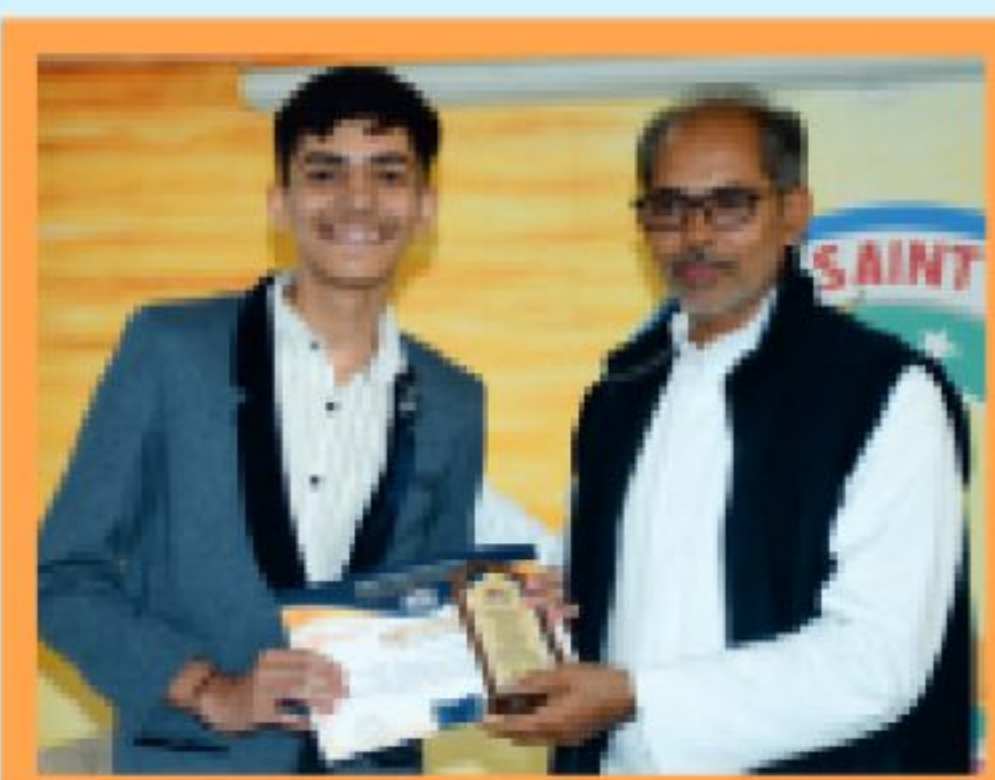
Their innovative project on the theme of the Competition - 'Robotics for Everyday Life' impressed the judges and demonstrated their exceptional skills in technology and innovation.

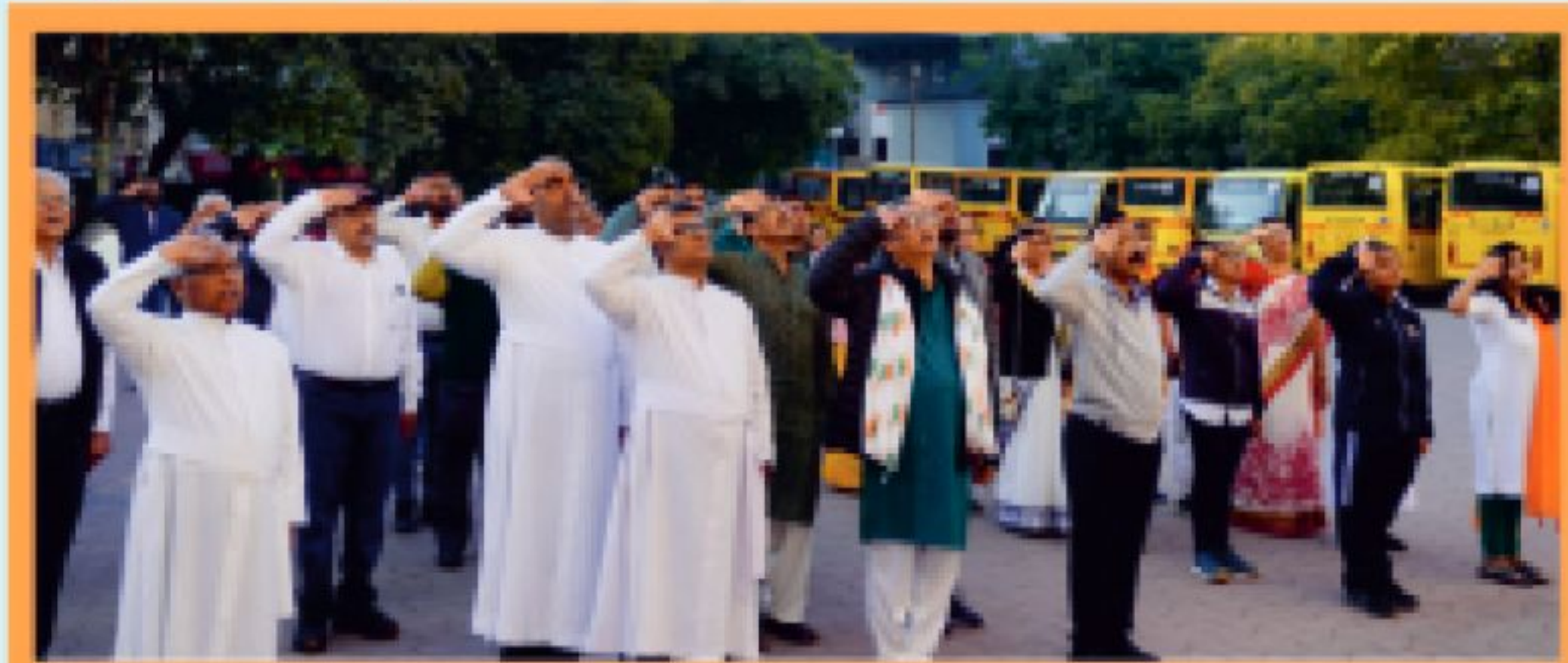
The event offered a beautiful opportunity for reflection, recognition, and celebration of the strength, resilience, and dedication of women across all walks of life.

Our dear Fr. Kuriakose Palakkatt CMI a man who embodied the spirit of friendship, understanding, and a quiet, yet powerful, dedication to those around him.

Born on the 28th of April, 1949, in Appanchira, Kerala, at his maternal home of Puthukulangara, and raised in the nurturing environment of Palakkatt (Palackal) family Thirunalloor, young Kuriakose was a thoughtful boy, marked by a deep capacity for reflection. This inner life led him, may be, at the tender age of twelve, to join the Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). Even then, his was a mind that brooded over the deeper meanings, a spirit that found solace and expression in the innate rhythm of music that flowed within him.

His early commitment saw him complete his B.Ed. as a brother, and he shared his knowledge and passion as a teacher in various CMI schools across Kerala. He taught in Pulinkunnu CMI school along with Fr. Jose Kariamadam. Mr. Mathew Chathampampil the father of our Prior General Thomas Chathampampil was also there as a teacher then. But destiny had a different landscape in store for him, leading him to the vibrant land of Gujarat at the loving persuasion of late Bishop Jonas Thaliath. Gondal became his major base, and for eleven impactful years, St. Mary's School flourished under his dedicated leadership as Principal. He was not just an excellent teacher, imparting knowledge from the textbook, but an available Principal, his door always open, his ears always attentive. His habit of visiting students' homes was not a mere formality; it was a window into their lives, allowing him to understand the silent struggles of the economically disadvantaged parents and the challenges faced by his students. He carried their burdens in his heart and sought to alleviate their pain.



Fr. Kuriakose In Pastoral Action

After his significant contribution in Gondal, Fr. Kuriakose embarked on a new chapter, pursuing a degree in music in M S University Baroda. It speaks volumes of his humility and thirst for knowledge that he embraced learning even from teachers younger than himself, excelling in his studies and further nurturing the musical gift that was so integral to his being.



Returning to Gondal Ashram, he took on the pioneering role of founding Principal of Navvidhan Gujarati School for the rural boarding children. Here, his deep empathy and understanding of their backgrounds shone brightly. He lived amongst them, sharing their meals, supporting their studies, and ensuring that even the most struggling students were given every opportunity to succeed. The consistent 100% results were not just a statistic; they were a testament to his unwavering belief in their potential and his tireless efforts to unlock it. The gradual but deep evolution from Fr.Kuriakose to Kuriakose Bapuji happened in Gondal Ashram over the years.

A period of spiritual awakening followed his time at Navvidhan, as he served as Chaplain at the Wankar cloistered convent. This experience deepened his spiritual insights and ignited within him a profound understanding of the need for inculturation. He recognized the beauty and power of integrating local traditions into liturgy, prayers, dress, and food, becoming a passionate advocate for making faith truly resonating within the cultural context.

His journey then led him back to the Gondal- Vinchhiya Mission, where his musical talents blossomed anew. He formed a Gujarati choir in Vinchhiya, teaching children not only classical music but also training them in vocal and instrumental skills. Choral singing became a vibrant expression of community and faith under his guidance. His generosity extended beyond the CMI community, as he played a crucial role in helping the FCC sisters establishing their school and convent in Jasdan. And it is no exaggeration to say that the thriving Shivrajpur campus of St Alphonsa School stands today as a testament to his vision and unwavering support.

In his final years, Parkinsonism cast a shadow, and he underwent treatments in Kerala and Rajkot. Throughout this challenging time, the Provincial House community cared for him with immense dedication. The kindness and love of his family members were a constant source of strength and comfort, their visits and support meaning the world to him.

Fr. Kuriakose's contributions leave an indelible mark. His instrumental role in securing grant-in-aid approval for St Mary's School Gondal and St Francis School Jetpur has ensured the continued flourishing of these institutions. His dedication to training countless children and aspirants in music, both within and outside the religious sphere, has enriched countless lives. And who can forget the beautiful rendition of the "Our Father" tuned in Gujarati, a testament to his commitment to inculturation? He was truly a cornerstone of the Gondal-Vinchhiya mission.



The lives of Ramaben, Dudabhai, and Babubhai from St Mary's Gondal stand as living testaments to Fr. Kuriakose's profound humanity. Ramaben was an "Aaya" in the school and even after her retirement, Fr. Kuriakose used to visit her quite often and it meant a world to her. Dudabhai was a dailywage worker in Gondal and he did dig the pits for all the trees in the campus especially the "pragvads". Babubhai was a driver in the school and was unmarried, in his old and sick days, Fr. Kuriakose took him to Fuljar and requested Fr. Roy Vakkayil to accommodate him there and Roy took good care of him till the last. Fr. Kuriakose was a great human being, first and foremost, always approaching life and people with compassion, empathy, and a genuine desire to uplift. He also put his best in Ribda-Lodhika, Jamjodhpur, Vadinar, Anjar and Surendranagar stations.

His demise leaves a void that can never truly be filled. He was an irreplaceable man, whose gentle strength, unwavering dedication, and profound understanding touched countless lives across Saurashtra and Kutch.

As we bid farewell to Fr. Kuriakose, let us not dwell solely on our loss, but rather on the rich legacy he leaves behind. May his memory inspire us all to emulate his deep humanity, his unwavering commitment to education, his passion for music, and his profound respect for every individual. May his spirit continue to guide us as we strive to do our best for the people he so dearly loved.
